Pakistan: COVID-19 Protection Sector Dashboard as of August 2020



Pakistan is participating in the Global Humanitarian Response Plan 2020 with a total funding requirement of USD126.82m (the protection sector requested USD17m) and aims to assist 1.3m people in need, with 5.46 million being most in need of protection interventions. The Protection sector brings together the government with 21 UN and non-governmental organisations, as well as child protection and GBV sub-working groups, to respond to protection risks due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This dashboard provides an overview of the Pakistan Protection Sector response and progress against indicators for the Pakistan COVID-19 Humanitarian Response Plan 2020.
