Situation:

Monsoon rains affect different parts of the country and resulted in the death of 310 people and 239 injured, damaging 217623 houses, (139102 partially, 78521 are completely damaged). No change in figures since 12th September 2020.

Sindh:

More rain was reported in different parts affected areas of Mirpurkhas and Umerkot which has increased difficulties for affected people living in temporary camps and affected villages. Malaria outbreak and water born disease is feared, fodder deficiencies and disease issues for the livestock is also experienced in Sanghar, Mirpurkhas, Dadu, Umerkot, Tando Muhammad, and Badin due to standing water. In some areas people are still facing access issues to the market for their basic commodities.

Response:

Hands in partnership with Star Network is providing food and NFIs to 2900 affected families in Kacho District Dadu. JAGGARTA is distributing NFIs and mosquito nets to 200 affected families of district Mirpurkhas. AWARE has provided. Art Foundation providing food packages for 900 families, 4000 hygiene kits, and 300 mosquito nets in district Mirpurkhas. ACTED is providing food packages to 2533 families district Mipurkhas. Malteser International has provided 4000 food bags to flood-affected communities in District Sanghar.

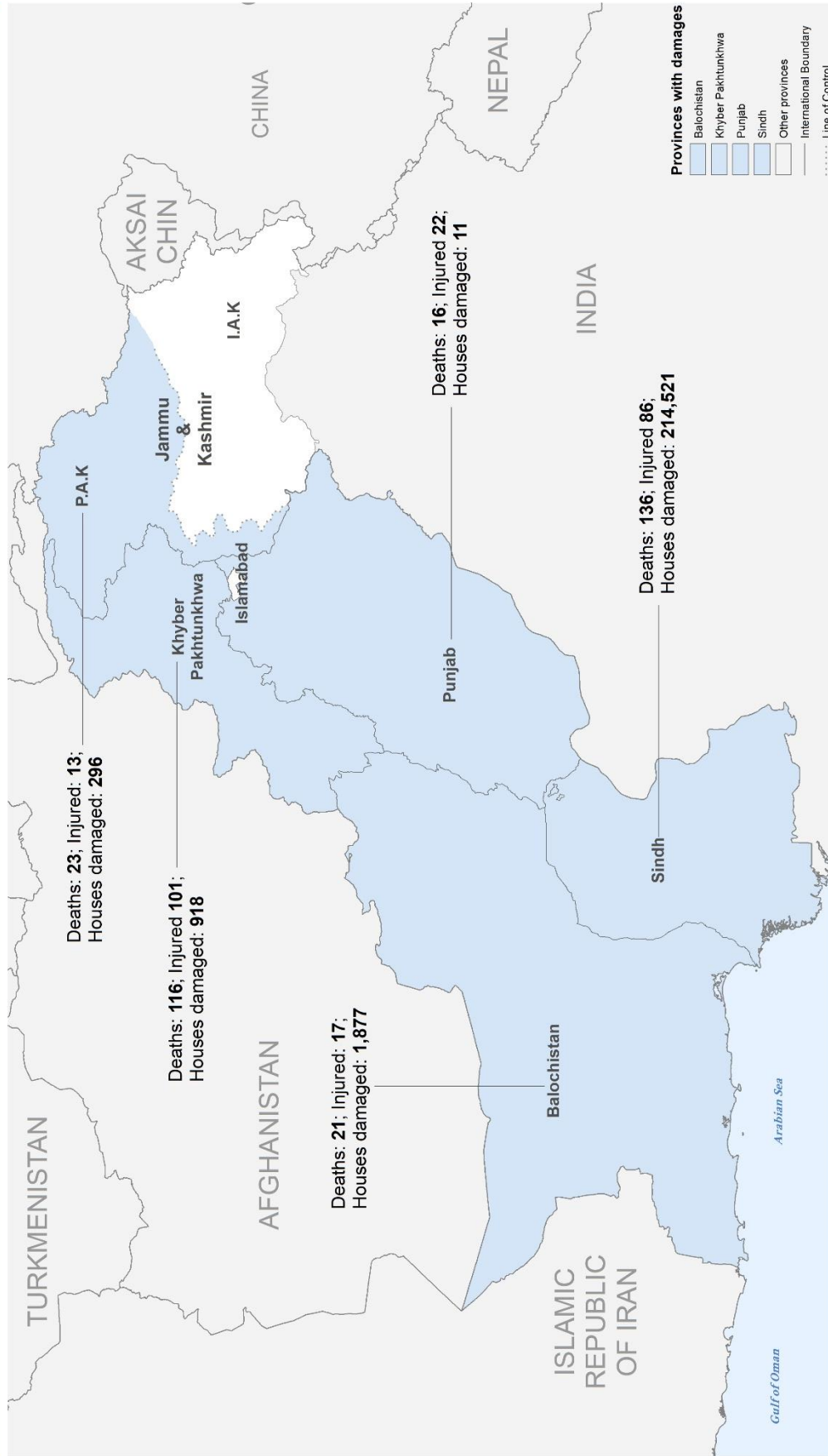
