

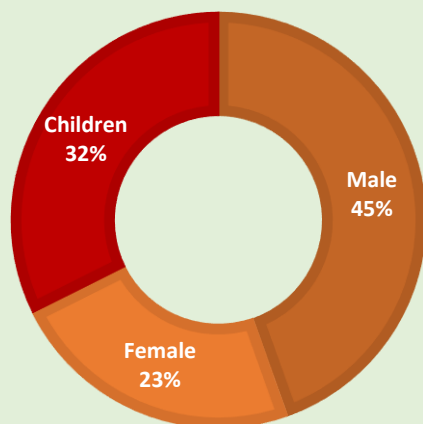
HIGHLIGHTS

- Isolated thunderstorm / rain is expected over the upper catchments of Rivers Indus and Jhelum along with South & Southeast Sindh. However, much of the weather over most parts of the country is expected to be mainly dry.
- Evacuation activities are being carried out in multiple districts including Karachi, Dadu and Khushab.
- Currently, low lying/kacha areas in Sindh along the River Indus are expected to likely get affected.
- Rescue activities were performed in Districts of Khushab and Karachi.
- Relief camps have been established in multiple areas of Sindh where over 23,000 flood affectees are taking shelter.

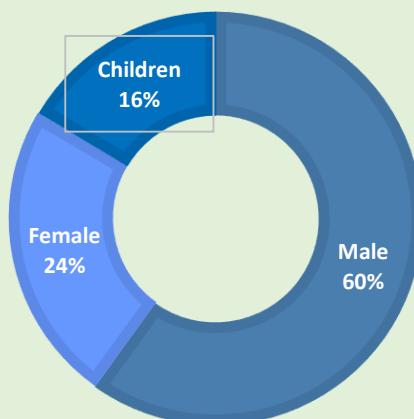
Total Deaths

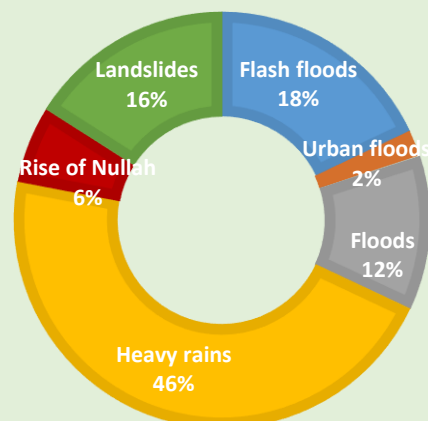

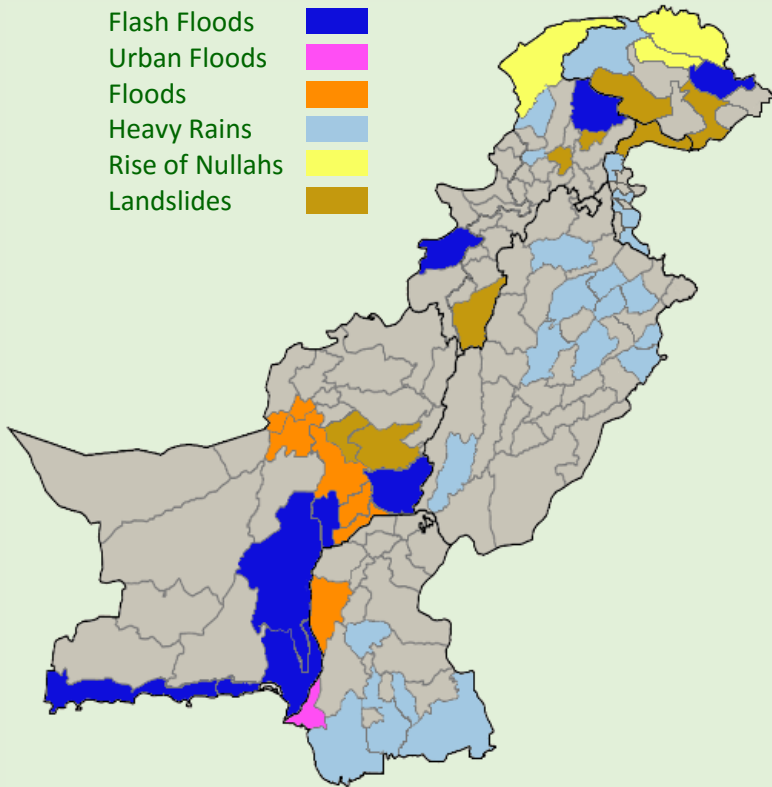

FLOOD ALERT

- River Indus at Guddu and Sukkur is in Medium Flood Level and falling and at Kotri is in Low Flood Level and rising.
- The higher water level in Mangla Reservoir, Tarbela Dam and expected rains over the upper catchments of all the Major Rivers which may result in increasing discharge of surplus water from Mangla Dam and Tarbela Dam.

Flash Floods	Blue
Urban Floods	Pink

Heavy Rains	Light Blue
Rise of Nullahs	Yellow

PHF member ACTED conducted a rapid needs assessment in four districts (Badin, Umerkot, Mirpur Khas, and Sanghar) in Sindh using a pre-designed ACTED standard tool. In light of the emergency, all assessed districts reported similar basic life-saving priority needs, as follows:

- Food (Rations) baskets
- Cooked food
- Milk and supplementary food items for children and pregnant and lactating mothers
- NFIs (Kitchen utensils, jerry cans, etc.)
- Provision of safe drinking water (water filters, and water trucking) and water purification items (Tablets, portable filters)
- Hygiene kits, mosquito nets and emergency latrines
- Emergency shelters/tents and blankets/ beddings
- Promotion of hygiene awareness along with nutrition key messages
- Debris removal from road and pathways
- Dry fodder for livestock and vaccination
- Medicines/ Medical Checkups
- Insect killer to protect the raw food items
- Transportation arrangements for old age people and PWDs during an emergency

PHF MEMBERS' RESPONSE

- International Rescue Committee (IRC) is to provide its support via emergency cash assistance and COVID-19 awareness to the flood affected communities in district Dadu and Jhal Magsi. Through the project, IRC will be fulfilling their food and urgent basic needs, targeting to benefit 3,000 households.
- In partnership with NDMA, Save the Children will provide food item and rations to 600 of the most vulnerable households affected by the floods in Karachi and Dadu. Furthermore, Save the Children provide eight dewatering pumps to support water removal particularly around key areas such as school buildings, Basic Health Units (BHUs) etc. to ensure smooth access to essential services.
- Human Appeal is also responding to the flood victims in districts Thatta and Tharparker, Sindh.
- Muslim Hands reached at various places of Karachi, Badin and Thatta and provided 2,200 hot meals and 1,000 (6 liter/bottle) bottles of clean drinking water to 6,400 households.
