The average level of global peacefulness improved very slightly last year on the 2019 Global Peace Index (GPI). This was the first time that the index improved in the last five years. The average country score improved by -0.09 per cent, with 86 countries improving and 76 recording deteriorations. Iceland remains the most peaceful country in the world, a position it has held since 2008. It is joined at the top of the index by New Zealand, Austria, Portugal, and Denmark. Bhutan has recorded the largest improvement of any country in the top 20, rising 43 places in the last 12 years. Afghanistan is now the least peaceful country in the world, replacing Syria, which is now the second least peaceful. South Sudan, Yemen, and Iraq comprise the remaining five least peaceful countries. This is the first year since the inception of the index that Yemen has been ranked amongst the five least peaceful countries.

In its annual report, the Institute for Economics and Peace has presented a comprehensive data-driven analysis on peace, its economic value, trends, and how to develop peaceful societies. The Sydney-based think tank reported that the average level of global peacefulness improved slightly in the 2019 Global Peace Index (GPI). However, trends show peacefulness since 2008 has deteriorated by 3.78%. According to An article by Waqas Ahmed on The Express Tribune on 21th September, 2019, referred a report by an international think tank, Pakistan has slipped by two points in an annual global index on peacefulness, finishing at 153 among 163 countries.

However, Pakistan has been named in top 10 beautiful and tourist attractive places and some International Think Tanks nominated two cities of Pakistan i.e. Islamabad and Lahore as one of the peaceful cities in the world. The Government is trying its best to present peaceful image of Pakistan. Present Government of Pakistan is also focusing primarily on peace, economic growth and climate change.
