


Highlights

- The humanitarian agencies have wrapped up most of their relief activities in Punjab.
- The Sindh government has also closed the relief activities in the province.
- Acute malnutrition is a growing concern in flood-affected areas of Balochistan and Sindh, especially among children under 5.
- As per WFP survey of 1300 house hold
 - 84 % have poor and borderline consumption patterns.
 - 60 % have low dietary diversity
 - 30 % adopted crises and emergency coping strategies.









PROVINCE WISE RELIEF
