


Highlights

- The recovery initiatives have started in the provinces.
- Ministry of planning and special initiatives is responsible for overall coordination of recovery initiatives on the 4R frame work.
- The relief activities are in their final stages therefore limited updates are being received from partners.
- The revised Pakistan 2022 Flood Response plan is only 68.2% funded at the end of August 2023.





Summary of Damages Floods 2022







PROVINCE WISE RELIEF













Province wise Recovery

Challenges Issues- Floods 2022 response

- Humanitarian agencies have to scale down their response interventions due to lack of funding.
- The availability of information on relief initiatives is not easily available due to lack of central coordination mechanism.
- Various partners are involved in response activities they are either not willing or do not have consolidated information at one place making it extremely difficult to get a clear picture of amount of relief being provided to the affected communities.
- Collection of recovery data from stakeholders is still a challenge.
- Issuance of NOC to local partners is still a challenge in some areas especially in Balochistan and KP.
